Who can apply?

We are looking for projects with evidence-based ideas and a clear understanding of unique value proposition. Applicants do not need to have established a company by the time of application but must do so if approved.

Where will I work?

We believe the best environment for your start-up is at BII, and most start-ups are located at our facilities in Copenhagen. If fulfilling this requirement is not possible, as may be the case for international start-ups, it is possible to apply for an exemption – please refer to the Applicant Guidelines. What is the duration of the program?

12 months (March 2025 - February 2026)
